ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF FLUTE –TENURE TRACK

DATE OF APPOINTMENT: August 16, 2012 (Classes begin August 20, 2012)

JOB DESCRIPTION: Assistant Professor appointment, full-time tenure track, benefits eligible. The primary assignment is the studio teaching of undergraduate and graduate flute students, coaching chamber music, and performing with the Laureate (faculty) Wind Quintet. Recruitment of flute students, and participation in Division of Music recruiting activities, is expected. Additional responsibilities may be assigned according to the needs of the Division of Music and the abilities of the candidate.

QUALIFICATIONS: The successful candidate will be an outstanding flute performer and teacher with significant performance experience. A history of successful collegiate teaching (including documented success in recruiting) is preferred. Master's degree (or internationally recognized equivalent) is required, doctorate (or equivalent professional experience) preferred. The candidate must be qualified to teach undergraduate through doctoral level students. Candidates must have excellent communication and interpersonal skills and enjoy working collaboratively in a vibrant academic environment.

RANK AND SALARY: The appointment is at the level of Assistant Professor and is a full-time, nine-month, tenure-track appointment. Salary is commensurate with background and experience.
